

For those of you who don't know, we embarked on a major update at the 7D Ranch starting last fall! We are nearly done building our brand new Big Buffalo cabin! We can't wait for this year's guests to break it in.

We started the demolition of the former Big Buff at the beginning of October, and it was quite a shock to see the lawn without that notable cabin standing front and center. Our builders / winter caretakers: Byron Kinkade and Jesse Tillotson have done an outstanding job. They have remained ahead of schedule with the whole project and they were able to use almost all of the old cabin logs in the new structure. The two of them milled all of these logs into boards and timbers which are now accenting the new cabin.

For those of you who are wondering, the new Big Buff will have 4 bedrooms, 2 bathrooms, a large, beautiful sitting room and can comfortably accommodate up to 8 guests. It was constructed in the same spot – just a newer version with the same feel of the existing cabins. We feel very fortunate to have the ability to take on a project of this magnitude. Thanks to all of you for your support in making it possible for this to happen. We can't wait to unveil it for the upcoming 2017 season.

The most remarkable thing about this project and our builders is that they have accomplished all of this and looked after the ranch in one of the most severe winters Sunlight Basin has experienced in the last 100 years.
